GWAC Study Group

For CPL Exam

The GWAC CPL Exam Study Group will meet every Tuesday evening from 6:00pm to 9:00pm at a location TBD every Tuesday evening (except Christmas, Thanksgiving and New Years Holiday weeks) starting on

14 September leading up to the May 2005 CPL exam. The program will be broken down as follows:

First Hour: Review of reading material assignment (the three books covered will include books authored by Blanchard, Langford and Coyle) at the rate of two chapters a week. A study group member will be given responsibility on a rotation basis to facilitate the review of reading material assigned for the week. Participants will be expected to read the material ahead of time on their own.

Second Hour: Review of slide handouts from the former MAL CPL Training Course This will give high level focus to major concepts and processes that need to be understood.

Third Hour: 20 CPL questions each week pertaining to the major reading material subject area during the first half hour followed by review of correct answers. This will help participants improve their skill at answering CPL exam questions. Also featured:

- Occasional Guest Lecturers will be invited to lead group discussion and present specific topics
- A certified CPL from GWAC to attend the weekly sessions on a rotational and/or sign-up basis in order to help in the facilitation and answering of questions.
- Participants will be required to buy the three books but they will be provided with a few discount web site addresses to purchase them from.
- Participants will be provided with a CD containing hundreds of sample CPL questions and answers.

The cost to participate in the Study Group will be \$145 (non-refundable after the first month) which will cover the cost of materials. Any left over funds will go to GWAC. See Announcement Flyer on page 15!

Combat Health Logistics Support in the Stryker Brigade During Operation Iraqi Freedom Part II

Predeployment Logistics

In preparation for initial deployment to Iraq, the ABCT medical community ensured that their medical equipment sets were filled to 90% or better, allowing them up to three days of supply, given a high intensity conflict, for trauma sets and five days for sick call sets. To further enhance medical supply readiness, units were issued combat lifesaver bags based on 10% of their personnel strength.

With unit organic sets filled, the subsequent priority was replenishment. The task: to develop a technique for re-supply that would support a limited initial push of CL VIII to organic sets. The outcome was the development of the combat configured load (CCL) and re-supply load (RSL). These CCL and RSL were designed and constructed in cooperation with the Brigade medical personnel, the Brigade Medical Supply Office (BMSO), and the Installation Medical Supply Office (IMSO).

The template provided for one CCL of 30 pallets every three days, starting D+3, to include litters and oxygen. One RSL was provided starting D+10, then every ten days thereafter consisting of 10 pallets with litters and oxygen. A CCL consisted of supplies that were used in high quantities over a short period of time. The RSL build was focused on those slow moving and or bulk

items.

The last medical supply predeployment mission focused on acquiring Medical Chemical Defense Material (MCDM) sets for 5000+ soldiers. The request went through the IMSO. Once the deployment order was given, the Surgeon General of the Army authorized the MCDM for release. The BSMO received the Brigade stocks of MCDM and issued it directly to the units.

The final aspect of medical logistics, essential to mission accomplishment was the calibration and servicing of medical equipment. All Brigade medical equipment was calibrated and serviced under the supervision of the BMSO. With only one medical maintenance technician this is an overwhelming task to accomplish in the 60 days prior to deployment. Coordination was made with the Medical Maintenance Section at Madigan Army Medical Center to assist in the performance of these services.

Logistician of the Year Award - Recognizes one individual who demonstrate exceptional vision and leadership in the general field of logistics and/or outstanding achievements/accomplishments in new or established methods, techniques and management of logistics or logistics systems. Do not recommend someone for Logistician of the Year. The award recipient will be chosen from among all nominations.

Logistics Specialty Award - Recognizes technical achievement and professional experience in and contributions to a given specialty of logistics. Nominations for this award should be developed around the individual with the suggested award title best describing the recognition. The following are examples of specialty award titles that might be used:

- Integrated Logistics Support (ILS) • Personnel Training • Inventory Control • Business Logistics Management • Technical Publications • Warehousing • Life Cycle Cost Management • Facilities
- Performance-based Logistics • Transportation and Handling • Post Production Support • Provisioning

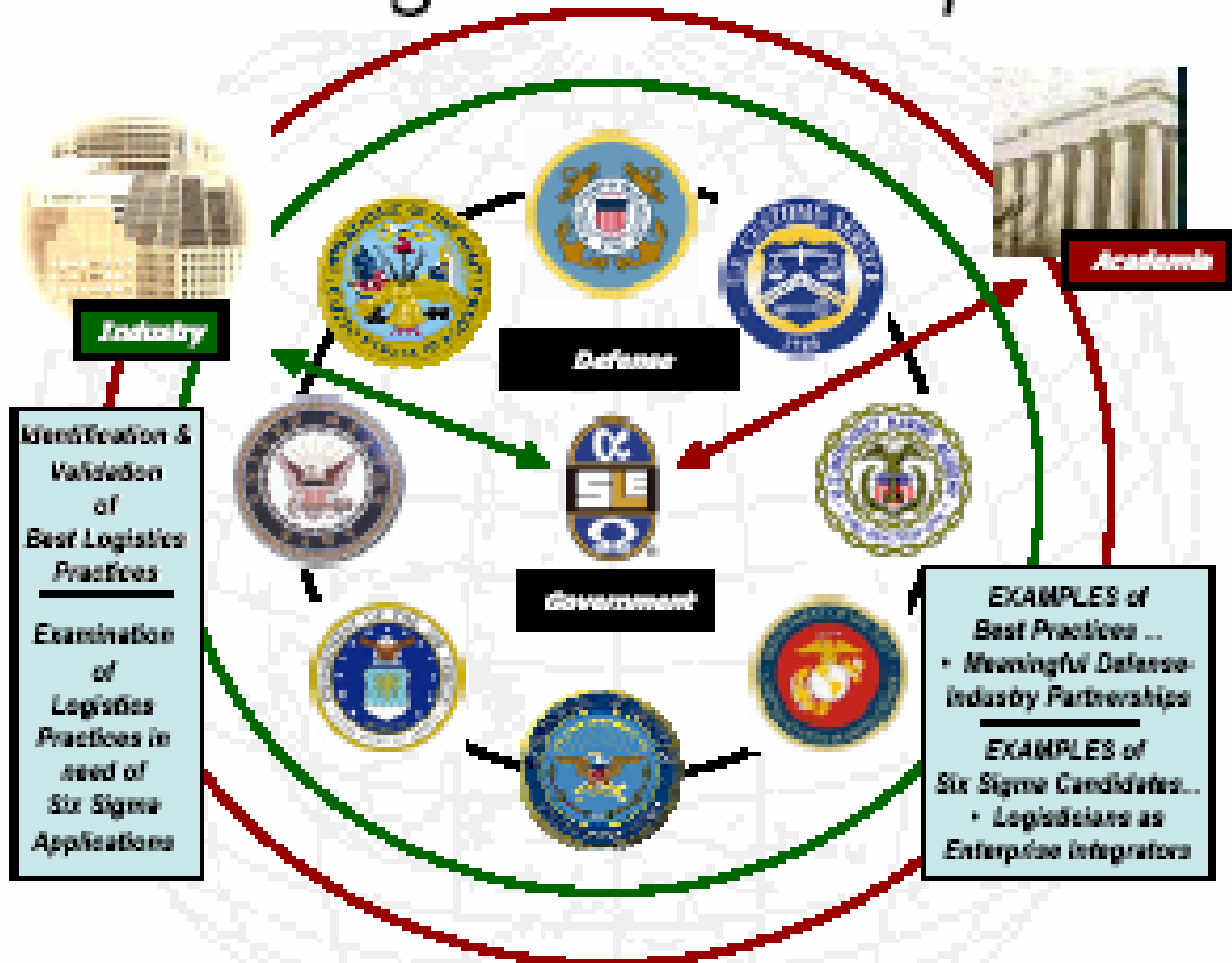

Directions to Dave's house:
